The UNDP-funded *Youth Innovation (Youth-IN): A Caribbean Network for Youth Development* program responds to the needs of youth identified in the report of the CARICOM Youth Commission (2010): 'Eye on the Future: Investing in YOUTH NOW for Tomorrow's Community'. The project promotes Caribbean youth INclusion, youth INnovation, youth INterest and youth INvolvement. It also addresses the challenges of young people in the region and provides them with opportunities to make a difference

in their communities and their nations.

A major component of Youth-IN is the promotion of youth entrepreneurship in the Caribbean and is implemented in partnership with the Young Americas Business Trust (YABT). The Caribbean Innovation Challenge combines an international competition and business start-up accelerator program that spurs the innovative and creative talents of young people in the region.

SIXTH SUMMIT MANDATE:
